OUR CATHOLIC FAITH**RELIGIOUS FREEDOM WEEK 2022: LIFE AND DIGNITY FOR ALL**

Religious Freedom Week begins this Wednesday, June 22 and ends the next Wednesday, June 29. During this week, Catholics are encouraged to pray and act each day for a specific freedom. The USCCB resources help us learn about religious liberty from a *Catholic* perspective, pray about particular issues and act on what we learn by advocating for policies that promote religious freedom. These religious freedom issues intersect with life issues in particular this year. www.usccb.org/ReligiousFreedomWeek.

June 22 – To build a culture of life and dignity for all, the Church must support women and children. We should all know how to help moms in difficult circumstances. While not trying to turn every parish into a pregnancy center, this program from the USCCB seeks to fill in the gaps local centers may have, and encourage parishes to connect with local institutions and accompany women and children. **Pray that we will have the vision and freedom** to do that. June 23 – An issue of concern is the wave of attacks on Catholic churches which began on May of 2020. A common incident is damage to statues. The reasons are sometimes related to perceived injustices from the past or destruction of pro-life messaging. **Pray that Christian witness in the face of these attacks convert hearts.** AND urge Congress to adequately fund the Nonprofit Security Grant Program. Take action at www.votervoice.net/USCCB/campaigns/93732/respond.

June 24 – **Pray that people of faith will continue to have the freedom to serve in life-affirming ministry of adoption and foster care.** The Child Welfare Provider Inclusion Act protects faith-based child welfare providers from being excluded from funding if they believe children should be placed with a married mother and father. Contact your U.S. Senators and Representatives to urge them to co-sponsor and support this Act.

June 25 – **Pray that civic leaders would promote life and dignity for all.** The Hyde Amendment is a bi-partisan provision which prohibits federal funding of abortions in the U.S. except in cases of rape, incest or to save the life of the mother. It has been part of federal appropriations for 45 years and has overwhelming public support. Hyde and Hyde-related policies saves lives and respects the consciences of Americans. June 19, 2022

Today, the second Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate a second solemnity, which marks our return to Ordinary Time. Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. At one time, this day was called Corpus Christi, Latin for “the Body of Christ.” In the most recent revision of the liturgy, the name for this day is expanded to be a more complete reflection of our Eucharistic theology.

The feeding of the 5,000 is the only one of Jesus' miracles to appear in all four Gospels. Luke places it between Herod's question, “Who is this about whom I hear such things?” and Peter's response to Jesus' question about who he thought Jesus was: “You are the Messiah of God.” In Luke the feeding is not the result of Jesus' compassion for the crowd but is instigated by the disciples. They wanted Jesus to send the crowd away to town. Instead Jesus tells the disciples to give them some food on their own.

The passage is meant to remind us of two feedings in the Old Testament: the feeding of the Israelites in the desert and Elisha's feeding of 100 people with 20 loaves in 2 Kings 4:42-44. It is also connected to the institution of the Eucharist. As in the Last Supper accounts in Matthew, Mark, and Luke and in Paul's account in 1 Corinthians 11:23-24, Jesus takes bread, looks up to heaven, blesses the bread, breaks it, and then gives it to the disciples. In using this exact language, Luke is reminding his readers that in this miracle Jesus is doing more than feeding hungry people as God did for the Israelites and the prophet Elisha did as well. The bread he gives is his body, which he will continue to give as often as the community breaks bread in remembrance of him in the Eucharist.
