

FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH, MARCH 19

The month of March is dedicated to St. Joseph, husband of Mary and foster father of Jesus. Below are six ways to grow closer to Saint Joseph during March:

- 1. Entrust every intention to his intercession.
- 2. Honor the fathers in your life.

- 3. Pray the St. Joseph novena. (See below)
- 4. Offer up your work to St. Joseph the worker.
- 5. Dedicate every Wednesday to his chaste heart.
- 6. Consecrate yourself (or your family) to him.

To pray the St. Joseph Novena, you'll want to start TODAY to end on his feast day, March 19. Please click on the QR code to get the prayers for the Novena.



Prayers calling on St. Joseph are unique. As St. Thomas Aquinas explained: "Some saints are privileged to extend to us their patronage with particular efficacy in certain needs, but not in others; but our holy patron St. Joseph has the power to assist us in all cases, in every necessity, in every undertaking."

In case you've wondered; Why is St. Joseph shown with a lily in his hands? The first is that lilies represent femininity, purity, and integrity, among other things. By having Joseph carry a lily, it shows that Joseph protected Mary's virginity. She is seen as a chaste, white lily. The lily is an emblem of Joseph's integrity and honor throughout Mary's life.

The fourth Sunday of Lent is sometimes called Laetare Sunday. Laetare is a Latin word that means "rejoice." Traditionally, Sundays are named after the first word of the liturgy's opening antiphon. On this Sunday, the antiphon is taken from the book of the prophet Isaiah (Isaiah 66:10-11). Even as we observe our Lenten sacrifices, we rejoice in anticipation of the joy that will be ours at Easter.

Today's Gospel reading is taken from John's Gospel. It consists of two parts. The first part is the final sentence of Jesus' reply to Nicodemus, the Pharisee who approached Jesus at night. Nicodemus acknowledged Jesus as someone who had come from God and seemed to want to be a follower of Jesus. Jesus greeted Nicodemus with the observation that one must be born from above to see the Kingdom of God. The dialogue between Jesus and Nicodemus that followed was about the meaning of this phrase. Nicodemus misunderstood Jesus at every point, but there was no animosity in the questions he posed to Jesus.

In the part of the conversation with Nicodemus in today's Gospel, Jesus referred to an incident reported in the Old Testament. When the Israelites grumbled against the Lord during their sojourn in the desert, God sent venomous serpents to punish them for their complaints. The Israelites repented and asked Moses to pray for them. The Lord heard Moses' prayer and instructed him to make a bronze serpent and mount it on a pole. All who had been bitten by a serpent and then looked upon the bronze serpent were cured. By recalling this story, Jesus alludes to the salvation that would be accomplished through his death and Resurrection. — Loyola Press
