OUR CATHOLIC FAITH



THE FINAL FAMILY MINI-RETREATS ARE THIS WEEKEND. We'll talk about saints and we'll search out some facts, but the big deal is, we will enter intentionally into the Communion of Saints and take new friends home with us.

The Communion of Saints is made up of people who are living and people who have died. It includes all the souls who have gone before us and are now with God. We call these souls the Church Triumphant. There are those who have died and are being purified of their sin in Purgatory, the Church Suffering. And there are all of us who are still working on our holiness by following Jesus here in our earthly lives. We are the Church Militant. The Communion of Saints is the Church! That includes you and me.

As Catholics we pray to saints for help because we recognize we are still in union with our brothers and sisters who have already died. Those who have fought the battles we now fight, suffered the things we now suffer, and found their way to victory *want* to help us run our races. They have finished their race, but they desire and love to help us with ours!

But do they really hear us? How? How does God hear ALL our prayers all at once all over the world? What about saints like Mary? Think of all the rosaries there are! How can she be aware? How can they hear, process and respond effectively even when millions of prayers are coming? The easy answer is probably in your car or on your phone – your GPS! Say what? Heaven has a GPS? No. But...

Our GPS works from a satellite. Signals are sent continually from GPS systems from cars and phones—imagine how many! - and information is sent continually, in near real time, accurately and with immediate effect! A satellite is a man-made amazing machine, but compared to God and the Power of Infinity, it's a shadow of amazing! If our satellites can operate with such efficiency and accuracy, imagine Omnipotent Omnipresent GOD! Our prayers matter. We can be assured, we are heard and even if it's not the response we want, we get an effective help. God is awesome!

May 15, 2022

Today's Gospel again comes from the Gospel of John. Like last week, today we hear words spoken by Jesus before his death and Resurrection. Jesus is teaching at the Last Supper.

John's Gospel does not include an institution of the Eucharist narrative; instead, Jesus washes his disciples' feet. Immediately after, Jesus predicts his betrayal by Judas. Today's Gospel follows that prediction. It can be read as a continuing explanation of Jesus' act of washing his disciples' feet. It begins with the announcement that this is the moment when the Son of Man will be glorified. This theme continues throughout John's Passion. Jesus will be glorified in his death on the cross and in his Resurrection, and the disciples will glorify Jesus in the love they show.

John's Gospel does not present a sentimental view of love. This is a type of love that is shown in service and sacrifice. It is difficult to choose to love when faced with hatred and anger. Jesus tells the disciples that all will know that they are his disciples because of the love they show for one another. This description of the early Christian community will be repeated in the Acts of the Apostles: "See how they love one another." Christian love is the hallmark of Christianity. We see it lived in the witness of the martyrs. We see it in the example of the lives of the saints. We see it in the holy women and men who live and love daily, making small and large sacrifices for others.


